



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN CHINESE CULTURE UNIVERSITY AND THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW MEXICO

1. Preamble

In accordance with the mutual desire to foster cooperation between Chinese Culture University (CCU) and The University of New Mexico (UNM), and in order to explore the potential for collaboration in the areas set out below, the two institutions have signed this Memorandum of Understanding.

2. Areas for potential collaboration

Based on the principles of mutual benefit, both institutions intend to explore opportunities to:

- (a) Promote interest in the teaching activities of the respective institutions:
- (b) Promote institutional exchanges by inviting students, faculty and administrators of the partner institutions to participate in a variety of learning, teaching and professional development;
- (c) Promote dual degree programs.
- (d) Promote other academic cooperation as agreed by both universities.

3. Implementation of Memorandum

Each party agrees that specific projects and activities will be developed for the implementation of this Memorandum based on discussions and negotiations between the two parties. Agreements or contracts shall be signed separately to carry out these projects and activities.

Each party agrees that any subsequent financial commitments will have to be determined on the basis of specific projects and activities and will depend on the availability of funds.

This Memorandum of Understanding will be effective upon the date of signature by the representatives of the two parties and for five (5) consecutive years. A party may terminate it any time by mutual consent or six months' notice in writing to the other party. The MoU shall be renewed by mutual consent after five years from the date hereof.





4. Data

That each party (1) will comply with all data protection and privacy laws applicable in its respective jurisdiction; (2) will protect personal and sensitive data against loss, unauthorized disclosure and access; and (3) will take appropriate technical and organizational measures to protect such data.
