Financial Responsibilities of Students.

- Home institution tuition and fees, including differential tuition and/or specialized course fees, which are NOT part of base tuition and therefore not included in the tuition waiver.

- Any host-institution special course fees, laboratory fees, or recreation fees
- Living expenses (accommodation, food, transportation, personal expenses, tourism, etc.)

- institution will provide all necessary information about housing options and application procedures with needed to help students obtain off-campus accommodation within reasonable proximity. each student's notice of admission. but room availability is not guaranteed. - 11. Families. **Families.** A student's proposal to bring his or her spouse and/or dependents is subject to the host institution's approval. The exchange student will pay all additional costs.
- 12. Faculty. any arrangements made by participants for exchange of accommodations, cars, etc. Faculty. The parties agree in principle to exchanges of faculty. The details will be negotiated in advance and will be governed by both parties' rules and policies. The parties are not responsible for
- 13. Program Review. The parties will evaluate the exchange program at least every two years to make any needed changes and to explore new opportunities for collaboration.
- 14. Direct Enrollment. Students may apply for direct enrollment at the host institution through the regular admission process and must pay all required tuition, fees, and other applicable costs. This Agreement does not apply to direct-enrollment students.
